# Hosting DinoDay

Have fun while raising awareness of disability and special educational needs by hosting DinoDay in your school or nursery – all while supporting Contact's vital services for families with disabled children.

#### Wear green (or a dino-themed outfit) for the day

Choose a day in June and ask the children to wear green or their favourite dinosaur outfit for a suggested donation of £1 per child.

You could also take them for a 19-minute stomp around your area!

- A dino-themed story with discussion topics
- Over 50 pages of dino-tastic colouring-in sheets

#### Why dinosaurs and why the number 19?

The inspiration behind DinoDay is a boy called Cameron Mathieson, who had Duchenne's Muscular Dystrophy and sadly passed away after spending over two years in hospital.

At that time, Disability Living Allowance (DLA) was taken away from children who spent more than 12 weeks in hospital. With our support, the Mathieson family successfully challenged this unfair rule in a landmark case at the Supreme Court and since then, no other family with a child who spends long periods in hospital has been denied this essential financial support.

Cameron's birthday is on 19 June. He loved dinosaurs – or as he called them, Dowsers – and his favourite Dowser was a green triceratops called Troy!

We also offer <u>dedicated 1:1 appointments</u> for parents and carers of autistic children in the Midlands and in London.

Our free Helpful Guide is an all-in-one printed booklet packed with information, advice and tips for families of children with additional needs. Schools can <u>order a reference copy on our website</u> and then signpost parents to order their own copy.


