

Contact through Covid

We supported 196,000 families over the year

- Information, advice and 121 support no break in helpline service and 44% increase in users of advice webpages
- Emergency support packages to those in need food, IT etc
- New Listening Ear service for in-depth emotional and practical support
- Fledglings free sensory and other products for families to use at home
- 300+ online workshops and podcasts
- £600k out to Forums and Rare Conditions Groups to support families through Pears/DCMS


The work of the NNPCF in representing parent carers of children and young people with SEND

It doesn't get any easier...

- Covid has caused new harms and exacerbated existing issues
 - Mental health and anxiety
 - Re-entry into school
 - Learning loss and catch up
- Covid has further stressed the SEND system which was at breaking point even before Covid 19
 - Even longer waits for health services
 - Lower school attendance for SEND pupils

...but you've risen to the challenge (again)

- Virtual coffee mornings
- Signposting services
- Conducting surveys
- Highlighting the issues
- Supported each other
- Supported the work of the NNPCF
- Been a mum, dad, grandparent, or a carer



For this year, we identified four priorities

Support the recovery from Covid 19

• Ensure that the parental voice is heard and work with government and the NHS to ensure that children with SEND are not further disadvantaged through recovery..

The NHS Long Term Plan


• Represent SEND families in the development and implementation of the NHS Long Term Plan which includes many important changes that will support our children.

Improve accountability in the SEND system

• Work with Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission to develop the next phase of local area inspections and continue our work on the SEND tribunal single route of redress.

The SEND Review (and some others)

• Engage in the work of the SEND review to support the DfE to create the far reaching changes we believe are necessary



Support the recovery from Covid 19

Yesterday

Worked with government and the NHS to represent SEND in response to Covid

- Changed lockdown guidance to accommodate the needs of those with SEND
- Inserted language into schools guidance emphasising the need to coproduce with families
- £1bn of schools catch up funding could be spent on SEND services (such as SALT)
- Return to school guidance emphasised a holistic approach not just attendance and behaviour

- DfE Covid 19 Vulnerable Children and Young People's Board
- NHSE CYP Stakeholder Council




- NNPCF co-chairs invited to join reconstituted SEND review steering group
