

STAGE 1: Case for Support

- Your case for support should sell your story, organisation, project and work clearly and concisely
- Your case for support should bring your work to life and should make a funder want to support you

Core elements you need to get across







STAGE 1: Case for Support

Using Statistics

- Using stats and figures in your applications can be a real asset to your case for support and highlights the need
- EXAMPLE:
- "Recent research through the Disabled Children's Partnership, found that 9 in 10 disabled children and their families were socially isolated (Then There Was Silence, 2021)"










Using the Charity Comission







Application process

- Differs depending on funder
- Might be a simple online form or a three stage process
- Some trusts publish their meetings dates or have open application cycles all year round.
 Decisions can take up to 9 months +

lf you don't know exactly, your dates can be estimates. But you need to start your projec at least 15 weeks from when you plan to send us your application.
We usually only fund projects that last 15 months or less. So, the end date can't be mon than 15 months after the start date.

- · How you'll make sure people know about it.
- · How you plan to learn from it and use this learning to shape future projects.
- Is it something new, or are you continuing something that has worked well previously?
 We can fund both new and existing projects.

Common Application Questions

What are the aims and objectives of your organisation?

How many beneficiaries will you reach?

What is your budget for the project and how much are you asking the trust to contribute to it?

How will you monitor and evaluate progress?

How will you fund this activity going forward?

What is your annual income/expenditure?







Additional Documents

Funders may also require you to provide additional information and documents including:

- Set of financial accounts/records
- Safeguarding Policies
- Constitution document
- Copies of Bank Statements
- Other policy documents

Thanking your Donor

 Formal acknowledgement – We recommend a formal letter acknowledging the donation






STAGE 4: Thanking, Reporting, Renewal

Reporting and Renewal

- At the end of the project or after 12 months, report back on what you have used their funding to do
- Some funders will have specific reporting formats or timelines e.g. an online form, or quarterly reports
- Others won't ask for a report. We recommend sending one – a report is also an opportunity to request they renew their support for another year
