
- 229 votes in total










If your child uses speech and language therapy services, are there any insights that you can offer about the benefits of early intervention?

Theme	Number of responses	Example responses
Education		Difference between successful education and not' 'Ensure there is joined up working with schools' 'Getting support early especially in conjunction with schools is key. At the moment schools cannot get support and so children suffer as schools aren't skilled' 5 'Ability to read'
Family relationships		It can prevent trauma of forcing parents to "parent" in ways that dont work for their child' 3 'Support for parents and carers that they might not have had before'
Other		Early regular intervention is vital' 'It took 3 years to gain speech and language support for my non verbal son. My other son is also non verbal and had SaLT from 6 months and the difference it has made in progress is substantial. Now I have to keep refusing to be discharged' 3 'Stops escalation into other overstretched services'
Accessibility		2 Early intervention would be amazing, but doesn't happen without informed parents knowing how to access it'
Emotional well-being		2 Impact on emotional wellbeing'
Confidence		1 Made a huge difference in becoming a confident communicator'
Health outcomes		1 It is an early flag for other health issues'
