This National Volunteers Week we want to say thank you to all the volunteers out there running and supporting parent carer forums!

Forum volunteers carry out such a wide range of activities. Whether it's representing parent experiences at local authority or health provider meetings, running events or offering a warm welcome to new members, th unpaid work they do is core to helping forums reach out to their communities and reduce isolation while pushing for service improvements for families of children and young people with special educational needs ar disability (SEND).

We asked parent carers what they like best about volunteering for their parent carer forum and here are some of the lovely comments we received:

"I feel like putting my energy into changing things for the future helped me deal with the present. I learnt so many strategies that helped at the time, and still do."

"What I like most about volunteering is meeting other parents/carers and feeling like I've made their day just that bit easier by listening to them and letting them know they aren't alone and pointing them in the right direction to find the support they need."

"I chose to become a committee member, first and foremost I think it's important that all SEND parents and carers are informed of all the help and support that is available to them. I also believe that as a collective voice we have a much greater chance of making real changes to improve ours and future children's lives for the better."

"I became a member as I want to make a difference in my area and how SEND is done in my area to the best of my knowledge, and get what's right for parents and young people."

- Opportunities to join 3 training programmes this year on topics such as being a Parent Representative, DARE resilience, Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, Leading your Forum, and Compassionate
 Communication. If you're part of a forum please tell us which topics are most important to you by completing this short survey. It should take only 5 minutes to complete, and the will close on June 13th at 12:00 noon. Keep an eye on your forum's inbox as we'll email you with any updates on training.
- A revamp of the forum handbook so you have an easy read guide all about forums, for when you first start out, or for coming back to as a reference as and when needed.
- Make use of the CIC assistance programme you can log into their website for lots of helpful info on wellbeing, and the subscription also includes a legal helpline and access to counselling for up to 8 parent carers. It's not SEND specific – it can be used for any issue personal or forum related.
- Access your forum's Community Matters Yorkshire's Knowledgebank subscription to get advice, information and support with governance and legal issues.
- At least 8 online learning sessions on topics of most interest to forums.
- Plenty of information sessions online on our <u>PCF YouTube</u> <u>channel.</u> Relevant for this week it does include a session on <u>good</u> <u>practice in volunteer management.</u>
